



# Workshop: Understanding Fuel and Transport Poverty and Associated Challenges for a Scottish Just Transition

#### What is it?

As part of a research collaboration between the University of Dundee and the University of Strathclyde, we are developing a workshop with community members to understand the links and joint challenges of fuel and transport poverty in Scotland, and to help enable a just transition to low carbon heat and mobility.

Our findings will allow solutions to be tailored according to community needs, taking into account the most appropriate technology, economic, social and community based solutions with the highest probability of success in tackling these challenges.

Note that all information collected from the workshop will be anonymised and we will not share any identifiable information outside the research project team.

### Where will it take place?

The workshop will last two hours and will take place on the Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2023.

To enable more people to join us, we will run two separate sessions on the day: 1 to 3pm and 4 to 6pm. At The Circle, 69-71 Aberdalgie Road, Easterhouse, Glasgow, G34 9HJ.

Coffee, tea and other refreshments will be provided. Sandwiches and other small bites will be served after the workshop sessions.
